The Weber Basin Water Conservancy District (WBWCD) announces the retirement of Tage I. Flint, General Manager/CEO. Mr. Flint, a Professional Engineer, has spent his entire 36-year career in the water supply industry and has been the General Manager/CEO of WBWCD for 21 years. As the largest water authority in northern Utah, WBWCD has thrived under Mr. Flint's leadership. During his tenure, the five-county service area has doubled in population, as has the amount of water infrastructure, staffing, and water deliveries. His efforts in bringing water to the high growth areas and in water conservation have been extensive. Mr. Flint has been a leader in state-wide water policy and planning and contributed extensively to maintaining Utah's strong economy through reliable water service.

The WBWCD Board of Trustees has selected Scott W. Paxman as the next General Manager/CEO. Mr. Paxman brings 35 years of experience in water purveyance and has most recently served as Assistant General Manager/CTO of WBWCD. Mr. Paxman is also a Professional Engineer and earlier served as the District Chief Operations Officer. He is excited to continue the reliable water services to the residents of five counties in northern Utah and is looking forward to the leadership role of a district that has excellent and professional employees.

WBWCD wholesales drinking water to over 60 cities and retailers, provides water to the largest secondary irrigation system in the country, supplies regional agricultural water, and delivers thousands of groundwater exchanges in Davis, Weber, Box Elder, Morgan, and Summit counties. The District operates eight major and many smaller dams and reservoirs along with, treatment plants, hydroelectric plants, and hundreds of miles of large aqueducts, pipelines, and canals. WBWCD is also a leader in water efficiency programs constantly striving to reduce the per capita use of water in northern Utah.
